GLENN J. LALLY
COLONEL, U. S. ARMY AIR FORCE
1918 - 1998

Glenn "Red" Lally was born in Belle Creek, Minnesota, entered the U.S. Army Air Forces in 1942 as a flying cadet. He went to England as a B-17 pilot and was shot down on his 29th mission while bombing an aircraft factory at Emden, Germany. He bailed out and was captured immediately, burned and wounded. Lally spent a month in the hospital and two years as a prisoner of war in Stalag Luft III and Stalag VIIA. After the war he served in the U.S. Air Force with distinction for 27 more years retiring as a colonel. He was married to his wife, Dorothy, for fifty-two years and they raised two children. He is buried at Fort Snelling National Cemetery.
