1938 - 1998

Earl D. Aman was born in Arkansas in 1938 and graduated from the Air Force Academy in 1961 and from flying school in 1963. Aman had a distinguished career in the Air Force including an exchange tour with the Royal Canadian Air Force and service in Turkey, Spain, Italy, and pre-Revolutionary Iran. He flew F-4s in combat from Ubon, Thailand in 1967-68. He survived being shot up over North Vietnam and was rescued after bailing out over Laos. He retired in 1989 and died of Lou Gehrig's disease October 15, 1998 after a courageous struggle. His decorations include the Silver Star, Purple Heart, and Distinguished Flying Cross. He married Lucy E. Rivers of Henderson, Texas in 1961 and they raised three children.
