Bill came to the Air Force Academy from Maine. After graduation with the USAFA Class of 1960, Bill gained his pilot wings and flew KC-135s with Strategic Air Command at Loring AFB, Maine. After earning an advanced degree from Syracuse University, he returned to the Academy in 1964 as a language instructor, then Associate Professor of French. Bill resigned from the Air Force in 1972, attended Massachusetts College of Optometry and practiced as an optometrist until 1997. During that time he served the Maine National Guard, rising to the rank of Brigadier General and State Adjutant. Bill retired to southern Maine in 1997 where he remained with his family until his death.
