Ross Orden Scarborough loved to fly and always wanted to be a pilot. With the advent of World War II in Europe, Orden became committed to the cause of freedom. He learned of the R.A.F.'s desire to enlist American Pilots and in December, 1940 he signed up. In April 1941, Orden was commissioned a Pilot Officer in the R.A.F. and sailed to England. He was part of the original cadre of Number 133 Eagle Squadron and later transferred to Number 71 Eagle Squadron. Orden was killed in a mid-air collision on 15 November 1941. He was one of the first Americans to give his life for his country.
