EDWIN S. "CHICK" CHICKERING

BRIGADIER GENERAL, UNITED STATES AIR FORCE

1912-2003

Brigadier General "Chick" Chickering won his pilot's wings and a regular commission in the US Army Air Corps in 1935. Appointed commander of the 357th Fighter Group in England at the outset of World War II, he later went into Normandy on D-Day Plus Two with advance elements of the Ninth Tactical Air Force. He subsequently assumed command of the 367th Fighter Group and led that unit until the end of the war. He later held numerous high-ranking command and staff positions in the United States, Korea, and Europe. After retiring from active duty, he achieved success and admiration as an engineer-businessman, community leader, and benefactor to numerous worthy causes and institutions. General Chickering died on 14 February 2003. He is survived by his wife, Mary Jim, his son and daughter-in-law, two grandchildren and a host of friends.
