LIEUTENANT COLONEL, UNITED STATES AIR FORCE RESERVE

Lieutenant Colonel Daniel O. Ordeson was awarded his navigator's wings and a commission in the US Army Air Forces in September 1942. First posted to North Africa, he flew 50 combat missions in B-17s with the 301st Bomb Group, Twelfth Air Force. He subsequently taught aerial navigation to members of the Free French forces in Oran, Algeria and to Chinese airmen at Pueblo Army Air Field, Colorado. He later was assigned to the 20th Bomber Command on Guam where he flew training missions in B-29s. Colonel Ordeson completed his wartime service as Officer-in-Charge of the Navigation School at Pueblo Army Air Field. Following World War II, Colonel Ordeson joined the Air Force Reserve and served for 11 years as a Liaison Officer for the US Air Force Academy.
