COLONEL, U.S. AIR FORCE (RET)
1918 - 1997

Louis Cummings was born in Grimms, Wisconsin and attended the University of Wisconsin. He entered the Army Air Corps in 1941 and instructed in B-24s and B-52s during World War II. After the war he graduated from the University of Kansas and earned a Masters degree at George Washington University. He served as a B-47 and B-52 pilot and squadron commander in SAC. After retiring in 1972 as the Base Commander of Andrews Air Force Base, he performed public service in Waldorf, Maryland. He was a dedicated Executive Director of the Air Force Historical Society from 1982 for fifteen years until his death. He is survived by his wife, Isabelle, three children and six grandchildren.
