CAPTAIN, UNITED STATES ARMY AIR CORPS

1918 – 2000

"Hank" Burman was the pilot of a B-17 named "The Hun Hunter" assigned to the 305th Bomb Group in England during World War II. His aircraft was shot down on a mission attacking the submarine pens at St. Nazaire, France on February 16, 1943. The aircraft spun out of control trapping all but one member of the crew, Dominic Lazzaro, who successfully bailed out. All other members of the crew were killed in the crash except Burman who, severely injured, regained consciousness crawling down a road. "Hank" regained his health and joined his comrades at Stalag Luft III where he was an inspiration and positive influence in the camp for the duration of the war.
